A little bit on Insurance and Concessional Licensing

What is my car worth? has been a very common question of late – and perhaps a very timely one! The price of many of our vehicles has increased recently. The best place to start is perhaps from a

reputable insurer (such as Shannon's) who are dealing with vehicle insurance and trades on a regular basis. Many of our beautiful cars are likely under-insured, and whilst no amount of money could replace them sentimentally if they were to be written off, ensuring you are adequately insured in the event of the worst is important.



Many of the cars registered with HCC of WA are concessionally registered (either under C4C or C4O4) with the Department of Transport (DoT). There are very strict guidelines around the use of vehicles with a concessional license. To not comply with these will absolutely give your insurer a reason 'not to pay out'. It's not really worth the risk!

Things to remember include (but most certainly not limited to):

- You must be a financial member of an approved club to be eligible for concessional licensing
- You must register an Impromptu Run (C404) or complete a log book (C4C) when using your concessionally registered vehicle
- You must display appropriate signs/stickers on your vehicle (depending on concessional registration type)




